- 1. Tailor-make a S1 Cross-curricular Bridging Programme for Pre-S1 students under the Refined English Enhancement Scheme (REES) (Major Concern 1)
- 2. Promote extensive cross-curricular reading through books purchased under the Refined English Enhancement Scheme (REES) & enrich students' vocabulary and enhance their reading comprehension skills (Major Concern 1)
- 3. Incorporate Drama in Education in the junior curriculum and enhance teachers' professional development in the use of drama in teaching through a QEF Drama in Education Programme (Major Concerns 1, 2 & 3)
- 4. Incorporate the elements of career mapping and workplace communication into the curriculum to raise students' awareness of career planning (Major Concern 2)
- 5. Organize after-school phonic courses for low achievers to improve their pronunciation and spelling (Major Concern 1)
- 6. Cater to learners' diverse needs through consolidation and enhancement programmes (Major Concern 1)
- 7. Improve grammatical accuracy in both junior and senior forms (Major Concern 1)
- 8. Promote positive values and consolidate students' learning through various outside-classroom activities and competitions (Major Concern 2)
