STEM Inno"vision"

Four students (4B Lam Kwan-ho, So Hei-long, Wu Hon-yung, 4D Li Lok-yin) won a Merit prize at the Joint Government Secondary School STEM Innovation Competition organized by the Arts and Technology Centre. The competition aims at enhancing students' awareness of healthy living and encouraging them to make suggestions for improving the lives of the elderly, neighbourhood and society. Our product "Standard Vision" was designed to help users correct their bad habits when viewing computer screens. It includes a distance sensor, a light sensor and a chatbox for information enquiries. When the user is in too dim an environment or in an improper distance from the screen, the system analysis will issue a warning to remind the user to adjust to the proper position or posture. Also, users can watch videos about eye exercises to relax their eyes. The competition provides alternative learning experiences and is a powerful platform to enhance students' problemsolving abilities.







"PolyU CubeSat Mission - Space Debris Removal" programme







Five S4 physics students (4B Yung Ho-yin, Zheng Wai-kuen, Fung Meisee, Lee Yin-yan Irene, 4D Fung Meiki) joined the "PolyU CubeSat Mission - Space Debris Removal" programme organized by the Department of Aeronautical and Aviation Engineering, the Hong Kong Polytechnic University Orion Astropreneur Space Academy (OASA). Aiming to remove debris, the programme featured lectures, lab visits and handson workshops with mentorship, which our students attended on Saturdays from 18 February to 29 April. Our team prepared a short video and introduced their idea of the CubeSat during the final presentation in front of a panel of judges, winning the "Special Merit Award" and a \$1000 prize.
