Strike Elektrika and Saktivis Daio & Aba Dhabi STEAM Tour 2025

To broaden students' international perspectives, our school, in collaboration with Shau Kei Wan Government Secondary School, co-organized the "Joint Government Schools Dubai & Abu Dhabi STEAM Tour 2025" from 27 April to 2 May 2025.

This exchange program provided 30 students from Secondary 4 to Secondary 5 in our school with the opportunity to conduct on-site investigations, exploring the latest advancements in technology and artificial intelligence while gaining deeper insight into the local history and traditional culture. Additionally, students examined the importance of sustainable lifestyles and ecosystems, enhancing their cultural understanding and interaction.





Here are some reflections made by the participants:

I am very pleased to have the opportunity to participate in the Dubai and Abu Dhabi STEAM learning tour. Although the itinerary was packed, it was precisely this fast-paced schedule that made me look forward to returning to Dubai in the future.

Dubai is a tourist destination, but due to its unique climate and geographical environment, we rarely have the chance to visit this Middle Eastern region and witness how Dubai has transformed from a place of camel riding in the desert into a bustling metropolis featuring the largest shopping mall, the tallest building, and the largest picture frame.

During this trip, we also sampled a lot of traditional Arabic cuisine, such as Arabic dates paired with Arabic coffee and camel milk. Additionally, at the Sheikh Mohammed Centre for Cultural Understanding, we learned about Arabic dining etiquette, such as shaking the cup to indicate that no refill is needed.

Among the various activities, the Museum of the Future left the deepest impression on me. The biobank at the HEAL Institute, with over 2,000 biological models neatly arranged, was a truly awe-inspiring scene


Participating in this exchange tour was highly rewarding, not only in learning about STEAM knowledge and Arab customs but also in gaining inspiration from the city's background and development.

HydroRace Challenge 2025

— Second Honour Award

On 14 March 2025, five S.5 Chemistry and Physics students participated in the "HydroRace Challenge 2025". Facing technical challenges, they successfully designed and built a model car, demonstrating excellent teamwork and impressive performance, which earned them the Second Honour Award.

Co-organized by the Education Bureau (EDB) and the Electrical and Mechanical Services Department (EMSD), the "HydroRace Challenge 2025" is a key event under the "Innovative Engineering Education Programme for Primary and Secondary Schools" (2024/25). This competition provides students with a STEAM-focused experience centred on hydrogen fuel technology, enhancing their understanding of hydrogen energy as a pathway to carbon neutrality, the value of low-carbon energy solutions, and the principles of sustainable development.

STEAM Bridge Design Competition Showcases S.2 Talent

From October 2024 to May 2025, all S.2 students participated in the vibrant 2024-2025 STEAM Bridge Design Competition, blending Mathematics, Computer Literacy, Integrated Science, and Visual Arts. Students mastered essential skills in Mathematics and Integrated Science, crafted computer models in Computer Literacy, and fused their skills with artistic flair to build bridge models in Visual Arts, while exploring modern Chinese and global bridge-building cultures. Each S.2 class formed six groups, creating 24 meticulously designed bridges that met strict weight, dimension, and material standards. On 16 May 2025, from 12:00 to 12:45, the school garden buzzed with excitement as three teachers from the four subjects selected two bridges per class—eight in total—for a fiercely competitive open event. All eight bridges aced the weighting test, and the entire student body voted for the Best Creative Bridge and Voter's Pick Bridge Award. The competing student teams displayed high enthusiasm and dedicated participation, creating a lively atmosphere of fierce competition. 韶關丹霞文化内地考察

本校有幸邀得賴博士於7月15日接受訪問,由校訊校園小記者(5D鄭穎思、5D尹姿淳)透過視像會議進行採訪,過程中賴博士慷慨分享學習及就業生涯的點滴,學生受益匪淺。

問:賴博士在沙官就讀時有哪些深刻難忘的回憶?

答:我記得最初入讀沙官時校舍還未建成,需要借用龍翔官立工業中學的校舍,所以住在沙田的學生便由鄧叔叔(校巴司機)駕駛校車接載上學及放學,過程中我便有更多機會與同學交流。後來沙官建成了校舍,一些貪玩的同學總是趁午膳時間到旁邊的球場踢足球,玩得全身濕透,下午回校時便被老師罵。還記得我當時屬於Jacaranda House (J House),我們的社總是在大大小小的比賽中勝出。這些都是在沙官讀書時十分難忘的回憶。

問:賴博士是在何時及如何發掘到對測量方面的興趣?及後 又如何朝著這個方向進發?

答:我中學時期特別喜歡地埋科,在地理科老師的引導下對世界各地,如南美州(巴西、秘魯等地)的不同建築特色充滿興趣,相反對經濟方面的科目則興趣一般。後來因為當時校長Mr. Jack Ormerod為學生提供到海外留學的機會,加上當時的班主任Ms Lee的鼓勵下,我升上中六後只讀了一個多月便決定到外國留學。入讀大學後,我透過有不同職涯規劃的攤位認識到測量師這個行業,而我對化學、物理等科的興趣不大,所以便決心朝著這個方向發展。測量師在當時的社會並不普及,英國只有四所大學提供有關測量師的大學課程,當時四所大學都取錄了我,我最後選擇了升讀英國伯明翰阿斯頓大學(Aston University, Birmingham)。

問:賴博士對於自己取得QS終身成就獎有什麼感受?

答:首先,QS終身成就獎是為了表揚傑出工料測量師在過去所作出的成就,以及對本地建造行業及社區發展的貢獻。回顧我在業內的工作歷程,我在1984年畢業便在英國開始工作,考取專業牌照,加入了第一所公司,協助其在新加坡及台灣拓展業務。後來我在1989年加入利比公司(Rider Levett and Bucknall) (RLB),在1992年升為合夥人,一直服務至2020年退休。在利比公司工作期間,我於1995年協助公司設立了上海的分公司,及後1997內地對外開放,我便協助公司在北京、廣州、深圳等地,先後成立了20所分公司。而2000年後,在全球化的大趨勢下,我們與澳州一所在建築界有悠久歷史的公司Rider Hunt及英國一所公司Bucknall Austin聯盟,在「一帶一路」的政策下組織

在東南亞發展業務,並進一步派人到歐洲、美國、南非等 地拓展業務。

另外,我在香港測量師學會中也盡力為學會進行推廣的工作,我曾擔任測量師學會青年組主席,並於2012-2013年擔任學會會長。由於當時測量師學會在內地沒有分會,於是在我任內期間便在北京設立辦事處,及後我更擔任內地事務委員會主席,協助測量業在內地的推廣及發展。以上這些都是我在業界內以及在測量師學會中所作出的努力,而獎項肯定了我在業界多年來所作出的貢獻。

問:你認為作為學生,我們應該抱持怎樣的心態去邁向成功 的道路?

答:我認為時間管理、團隊支援及家人的支持都十分重要。我在2000年曾在理工大學進修碩士課程,同時也要兼顧公司的業務,工作確實十分繁重,幸得家人的支援才可平衡各方面的工作,欠缺任何一方的支持都不可能完成。此外,我認為對工作的熱忱也十分重要,在面對拓展新市場的挑戰及各項繁重的工作時,惟有願意拼搏,不怕辛苦,迎難而上,才會成功。我當年在開拓韓國市場時,為了裝備自己去進修韓文,當時大多數學員都是為了追韓劇而去學習韓文,只有我是為了工作需要去進修,但我不因此而覺得辛苦,反而十分享受面對挑戰的過程。我寄語年青人,在面對未來發展路向時,最重要是找到對工作的熱誠,並以謙遜的態度面對重重困難及壓力。

問:賴博士對沙官的學弟學妹有什麼訓勉的說話?

答:首先,在現今社會,即使公開考試未如理想,不能入讀自己心儀的學校,也不要灰心,只要找到自己真正喜歡的領域,以謙遜的態度勇往直前,終有一天可以達致自己的目標。此外,我認為飲水思源也十分重要,我當年面對是否要到海外升學曾猶豫不前,幸得班主任關太的鼓勵,才令我肯定到海外留學的選擇,雖然她自己也未必記得曾經鼓勵過我,但我卻永遠記得她當年的支持、鼓勵。最後,在這個資訊發達的年代,年青人更需要有創新的精神,勇於嘗試,最重要的是掌握人與人之間相處的技巧,了解人與人之間的連結,這些是人工智能無法取締的能力,也是現今青少年更應加以發展的技能。
