Major Concerns 2024-2025

Major Concern 1: To develop students to be active learners

1 To develop students' active learning to foster engagement and ownership

1.1 Making use of resources (e.g. apps, eLearning resources, official data, videos, reference books) to facilitate learning

Achievements

• Teachers and students made use of the resources concerned to facilitate learning.

Reflection

- 95% of students reflected that the resources facilitated learning.
- 100% of teachers reflected that the resources facilitated learning.
- 1.2 Creating notes after completing a selected section to reinforce a main concept

Achievements

- *Note-making workshops were conducted for S1 students.*
- Students displayed understanding of the selected unit in their own words, possibly with modification and elaboration.

Reflection

- Students reported that creating notes facilitated learning.
- Teachers reflected that the content of the notes contained elaboration or additional information.
- 1.3 Conducting self-learning project: Students are required to study a topic, a chapter or some sections of a chapter for self-directed learning. Products could be a group presentation, a video, a worksheet completed, a quiz completed. (S1-3: Chinese, English, Mathematics; S4/S5: elective subjects)

Achievements

- Self-learning projects were conducted.
- *Peer quiz questions were set.*
- Students exhibited self-learning skills and subject-related skills.
- Teachers observed that students became more engaged learners and were empowered to take ownership of their learning.

Reflection

- 95% of students mastered the self-learnt content.
- 93% of students agreed that setting high-order quiz questions improved self-learning skills.
- 100% of teachers reflected that students' self-directed learning skill was strengthened.

2 To enhance Reading across the Curriculum to equip students with a broad and solid knowledge base

- 2.1 Students being active readers who actively respond to morning period (every Wednesday if possible) reading materials selected from various disciplines
- 2.2 Students and teachers integrating online reading resources on selected cross-curricular topics into the curriculum with peer quizzes/ reflections, presentations, theme-based forums and effective use of Google Classroom as a self-directed learning platform
- 2.3 Designing a School-based RaC Curriculum for all levels to further develop students' literacy skills, attitudes and world knowledge

Achievements

- Students actively responded to morning period reading materials selected from various disciplines.
- Students and teachers integrated online reading resources on selected cross-curricular topics into the curriculum on Google Classroom.
- An S1 to S6 RaC Curriculum was designed.

Reflection

- 85% of students reported that highlighting key words, making annotations, or completing the follow-up task helped them understand more about the content of different topics.
- 96% of students selected appropriate materials.
- 96% of students further enriched their knowledge, heightened their interest in the online resources and also sharpened their language skills.

• *Teachers observed that students built broader and more solid knowledge.*

3 To strengthen students' ability to integrate and apply knowledge and skills within and across the KLAs of STEAM subjects to understand daily life issues

- 3.1 S2 students design experiments or apply knowledge across Science, ICT, Mathematics and Visual Arts through thematic STEAM design competitions to enhance creativity
- 3.2 Senior form science students apply the knowledge acquired to explain the principles of technology or natural phenomena in unfamiliar as well as familiar situations

Achievements

- S2 students designed a bridge in groups.
- Senior form science students applied the knowledge acquired to explain the principles of technology or natural phenomena.

Reflection

- Students could set their experiment objectives
- Science process skills e.g. classification, observation, hypothesis, prediction, deduction, conclusion, were strengthened.
- Students' self-learning skills, problem-solving skills, creativity and critical thinking skills were strengthened.
- Teachers reflected that students demonstrated their capacity to integrate and apply their knowledge and skills across academic disciplines.

4 Through thematic learning, students are able to understand contemporary issues at personal and community levels

- 4.1 S2 students have to carry out a PSHE study on the topic of their place of ancestry in order to deepen their understanding of their hometown and origins. (Geography, Chinese History, History, Life and Society, Chinese, Chinese Literature and National Education)
- 4.2 Hydroponic vs organic farming Project in S3, in which students find a topic of their interest, set project plans and research accordingly

Achievements

- S2 students carried out a PSHE study on the topic of a Chinese city or province.
- S3 students carried out a research on the theme "food".

Reflection

- Teachers agreed that students' inquiry skills, field study skills, communication skills and collaboration skills were strengthened.
- 98% of students deepened their understanding of their motherland.
- 95% of students agreed that the project could raise their awareness about healthy lifestyle.
- 92% of students nurtured holistic thinking skills (i.e. the integrative use of critical thinking skills, creativity and problem solving skills).
- 100% of teachers reflected that students' holistic thinking skills were strengthened.

5 To build learning communities to strengthen teachers' competencies to be facilitators of students' active learning

- 5.1 Pedagogical workshop(s) on active learning methodologies for teachers
- 5.2 Good practice sharing of active learning implementation in Collaborative Lesson Preparation sessions or Staff Development Days
- 5.3 Learning communities for professional exchange to enhance classroom interactions

Achievements

- A workshop on classroom learning and teaching methodologies was held.
- Good practice sharing sessions were arranged.
- *Learning communities were formed.*

Reflection

- Teachers agreed that the workshop helped them understand the paradigm shift to facilitating active learning.
- 100% of teachers reflected that learning communities could strengthen their competencies to be facilitators of students' active learning.

Feedback and Follow-up

The school's commitment to STEAM and information literacy education positions it as a forward-thinking institution dedicated to preparing students for a technology-driven future. By implementing the strategies - enhancing AI integration, embedding information literacy across curricula, and fostering interdisciplinary collaboration - the school can further empower students to excel in an information-rich, innovation-focused world. Continued investment in these areas will ensure students develop the critical skills needed to navigate and contribute to modern society effectively.

Major Concern 2: To promote students' well-being through learning experiences to lead a healthy lifestyle with positive values

1 To enhance students' capacity of facing challenges so as to develop a healthy lifestyle with positive values

Achievements

- Mental Health Week, successfully held in November 2024, aligned with the 4Rs mental health charter (Rest, Relaxation, Relationship, and Resilience) and was co-organized by various committees. The event featured a diverse array of activities, including game booths, exhibitions, cooking classes and morning assembly sharing sessions, providing students with meaningful opportunities to gain insights, develop skills, and engage in activities that promoted their mental well-being.
- A "Day of Failure" for S4 and S5 students to enhance resilience through engaging challenges. These activities fostered a growth mindset, helping students embrace failure as a learning opportunity. Breathing exercises and reflections on diverse life journeys aided in managing emotions like frustration.
- In cultivating students' healthy mindset and lifestyle, the Guidance Committee, the school's social workers and student peer counsellors held regular lunchtime programmes throughout the school year. Over 690 students participating in the eight lunchtime events held throughout the year.
- In S3-S5, tailor-made positive thinking workshops were conducted on Other Learning Experiences (OLE) periods to incorporate elements of Nagomi Pastel Art, mindfulness, grounding, and positive psychology, allowing the students to cultivate their ability to apply positive thinking skills when facing stress in life.
- Life-wide learning Days were held on 6th March and 7th March 2025. All students participated in various well-organized activities to broaden their capacities and horizons. The junior form students joined workshop on Chinese Craftmanship, Face-Changing Opera Show, service training and study tour to Foshan to enhance their sense of voluntary service and national identity. While the senior form focused on activities enriching their knowledge about the development of Hong Kong and Mainland China. All the events allowed students to learn outside the classroom and develop a

- greater interest in social development.
- A structured school-based Other Learning Experiences curriculum was planned to provide students with a broad and balanced learning framework, including activities such as a financial planning workshop, Chinese craftsmanship workshop and workplace visit.
- Morning jogs organized by the Physical Education (PE) Department continued in this school year. Special training such as dodgeball, rope skipping, rowing, golf, cricket, kung fu fan and yoga were held in the PE lessons.
- The STGSS Careers Expo 2024, a key event organized by the Careers Committee with strong support from STGSS alumni, captivated attendees with engaging thematic talks and sharing sessions. The event thoughtfully incorporated elements of filial piety, enriching the experience and promoting positive values among participants.
- The National Education Committee, National Security Education Committee, and Chinese Club jointly organized a series of activities, such as the celebration of Chinese New Year, a board display on current developments in China, and a talk on Chinese culture. All students visited the National Security Exhibition Hall to learn about country's development and achievements since reform and opening up. On the other hand, senior students joined the "Heart to the Motherland: Traditional Chinese Medicine Competition to enhance students' national identity.
- To enhance media literacy, selected S4 students joined the Hong Kong Federation of Youth Groups' M21 multimedia classroom. From September to January, the students attended weekly workshops led by professional directors, learning media production, filming techniques, and scriptwriting skills. They practiced shooting film clips independently and produced a final work, fostering creativity and technical expertise in media-related activities.
- To enhance class unity, foster a disciplined and orderly learning environment, various inter-class competitions namely the Classroom Cleaning Competition, the Discipline & Cleanliness Competition, the Tidy Uniform Competition and the Inter-class Attendance and Punctuality Competition was held. Green prefects and Student Environmental Protection Ambassadors were also enrolled to carry out inter-class activities on waste reduction and energy-saving. Through these activities, the students' leadership and class spirit were steadily nurtured.

- The "Volunteer Together" Programme, co-organized by the Hong Kong Jockey Club, BGCA and our school, provides training and service opportunities for S2 and S4 students. Form 2 students participated in a volunteer service activity aimed at fostering intergenerational harmony. They received training to enhance their skills in planning events for the elderly. Students then engaged in interactive activities at an elderly centre, which improved their interpersonal communication skills and empathy.
- Starting in October 2024, S4 students attended training sessions focused on communication with ethnic minorities and individuals with disabilities. In July 2025, they applied their skills through various service activities, including playing games with the visually impaired and assisting ethnic minorities.

Reflection

- 96.2% students reflected that school activities promoting the mental health 4Rs, such as Mental Health Week, morning assembly sharing, stretching experiences, and mindfulness experiences, helped them increase their awareness on mental health.
- Through the tailor-made positive thinking workshop, over 99% of S4 and S5 students acquired the skills to accept different emotions in life and to apply positive thinking strategies in their daily lives.
- Through immersive experiences and guided visits, students deepened their understanding of Chinese history and cultural heritage. Many expressed that the trip broadened their perspectives and enhanced their appreciation for the nation's traditions and values. 96% of students agreed that the Life-Wide Learning Day activities not only created meaningful learning opportunities, but also strengthened their motivation and enhanced a broad range of skills.
- 95.2% of S4 students and a full 100% of S5 students agreed that the activities broadened their horizons and enhanced their knowledge base, while also helping them develop essential generic skills.
- Schoolwide, 95% of students agreed that the sports activities arranged by the PE Department promoted their physical health.
- 98% of students reflected that they received updated information and emotional support from alumni mentors across a diverse scope of jobs through the activities of Careers Expo. Over 90% of students agreed that the career activities and programmes offered by the Career Committee enabled them to have a clearer insight into their life and career planning.

- 96% of all students agreed that the morning assemblies instilled positive values for their whole-person development. National and global identity were enhanced through these thematic events.
- Over 96% of students agreed that the Life Education Programme held during class teacher periods enhanced their understanding of positive values.
- In S2, 98% of students raised their awareness of caring for the elderly who needed help. Almost 95% agreed that they knew more about the spirit of doing voluntary work and had raised their sense of caring for others. In S4, over 96% students reflected that service learning significantly enhanced their leadership, collaboration, communication, and caring abilities.

2 To uphold students' positive values across different KLAs/ Committees and through different thematic programmes.

Achievements

- Positive values like diligence, law-abidingness, empathy, perseverance, and benevolence were enhanced among the participants of the subject activities and experience sharing organized by the subject departments, teachers, and students.
- More than 90% of the Key Learning Areas (KLAs), subject departments, and/or committees designed learning tasks for each form with specific elements of positive values.
- Values Education Week was held from 18th March to 21st March 2025 to promote practice of positive values like perseverance, diligence, courtesy and mental well-being. Postcards promoting the values were designed to reinforce these core values. Interactive booths were set up where students could take instant photos with peers, fostering stronger relationships and encouraging relaxation. Activities like rope skipping competition, life education comics design, song dedications, courtesy-themed board displays, along with game stalls were held to enhance students' awareness and promote the practice of positive values.
- A "Values Education Day Camp" for Form 1 students in collaboration with the Pat Heung Junior Police Call Centre was organized. Activities included adventure challenges, foot drill training and interactions with alumni, promoting confidence, teamwork, law-abiding awareness, and career planning.

Reflection

- 96% of all students agreed that by completing the tailor-made themebased learning tasks, they understood the meaning of different positive values.
- Over 97% of participants agreed that the Values Education Week was successful that they have become more positive after participating in the activities concerned.
- Most of S1students reflected that the camp reinforced the value of unity and heightened their commitment to law-abiding principles, contributing to the development and preservation of a harmonious and inclusive society.

Feedback and Follow-up

- Objectives of Major Concern 2 were successfully achieved.
- More work will be done to enhance students' positive values and strengthen their well-being through establishing a healthy lifestyle.




